FROM THE BOARD

As we move into a new year, we felt it was important to remind our residents that per the Declaration of the Association, Article VI, Section 6.1 (B), the Association shall maintain the lawn and landscaping on all individual lots. However, it is the homeowner's responsibility to replace any dead or dying lawn areas or landscaping materials, including shrubs. All replacements must be selected from the approved list found on our website.

Since last August, there has been an ongoing sod replacement effort throughout the community. The sod being replaced is to restore that which was killed off prior to June of last year. There are three specific causes for this dead sod. They are from the inappropriate use of Round Up and lack of needed irrigation repairs/ maintenance prior to June 2019 plus a turf fungus. No other areas of dead sod except those caused by the above will be replaced by the HOA.

We have had several requests for sod replacement between homes where it has gradually disappeared leaving mostly dirt and/or weeds. Throughout the years soil has settled and shifted around many homes. This has resulted in low lying areas that collect water where the drainage is no longer effective. These wet areas prevent sod from growing yet provide fertile ground for moisture-loving weeds. In addition, trees have now matured and are now creating significantly more shade to many lawns. This additional shade prevents moisture-evaporating sunlight from reaching the ground and is also a contributing factor.

While the ongoing effort to replace sod will continue, please note that the HOA will not be responsible to replace sod except for sod that has been killed off due to the three causes stated above. All other sod replacement will be the homeowner's responsibility. For those residents with insufficient drainage or excessive shaded areas we recommend expanding your plant beds with mulch or rock. Please remember to apply for ACC approval should you want to make this change.

Lastly, residents who have requested no chemical spraying to their lawns by the HOA, please know that this request includes no spraying of all chemicals including fertilizer, weed control, pest control and any others deemed necessary by the HOA's professional landscaper. Opting out will make this part of your lawn maintenance become your responsibility. Any homeowner's lawn that no longer meets the community wide standard may be subject to possible violations and fines.

I hope you all had a wonderful Holiday Season with family and friends. Now here we are fast approaching spring. As you look around the neighborhood we have a lot going on right now. Improvements at the clubhouse, Bluestream coming in, roofs being cleaned and homes being painted.

While this is all going on, I wanted to take a moment to remind residents to please look at their own homes for the items below as we do our spring cleanup. Should you have any questions, please feel free to reach out to me. Dirty and/or black molded and/or oil stains on driveways, walkways

- 1. Commercial vehicles are not permitted
- 2. Pickup trucks in driveways without the needed cap on the bed.
- 3. Homes with dead or dying hedges- replacement needs
- 4. Plant beds needing mulch
- 5. Landscape borders: should be neat in arrangement and clean of black mold

6. Outside storage: garbage cans, recycle bins, lawn tools, wheel barrels etc., are not permitted. Be sure to store all items in your garage.

7. Please be sure screen cages are clean of mold with no torn screens.

Please be sure when walking your pets, to carry a bag with you and be courteous to your neighbors and pickup and then dispose once you get back home.

The Retreat Sizzlers Pickleball Group is alive and flourishing at The Retreat at Seabranch with new players and offering lessons to those interested in picking up the sport.

The sport is growing in popularity, nationwide, according to statistics, and is sweeping the nation as the fastest -growing sport in America, with 75 percent of its core participants aged 55 or older. 


